GRHBA Report:

- Financials: Jim Rich reviewed the financials which were distributed at the meeting. \$5,000 will be paid in March for the 2023 brochures. The checking account balance as of 2/28/2023 was \$53,793.88.
- GRHBA is seeking volunteers to serve on our Board of Directors. Board meetings are once per quarter. Looking for a volunteer to help with virtual meetings at our monthly meetings. Contact Suzanne or Cindy if interested.
- Remote lock and signs for the Visitors Center are ready for the season. The Visitors Center will open April 1.
- Spring advertising for GRHBA is underway with ads in Bay to Beach, What's Up Annapolis, etc..
- Ribbon Cuttings are planned for Blue Heron Oyster House & Rock City Café. Details to follow.

Main Street Rock Hall (MSRH): Laurie reported there were 8 applications requesting \$52,000 for the \$25,000 Building Improvement Grant for businesses in MSRH district. 5 Projects were selected and sent to DHCD for approval. The \$10,000 MIP Grant will be used to restore the "Old Salt" statue at the corner of Rt. 20 Main St. Additional funds are being sought for a "pocket park" at the same location. Next MSRH Meeting is 4/20 at 9:00am at The Mainstay. All are welcome. Pirates & Wenches 2023 meetings have started. Next meeting 5:00pm on 4/17@Java. Volunteers are needed. Economic & Tourism Development: Jamie Williams reported they are fully staffed now. Shalyn is Tourism Manager, Rose Osborn is administrative assistant.
